After planning is complete, students should create a first draft of their letter.

Next, depending on the age and/or ability of the students, editing and revising can be done by the teacher, by the students themselves, or with peers before creating a final draft of the letter.

As an extension or follow up activity, students can reply to each others' letters by role playing as the historical figure addressee.
